PRO-LIFE RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

The following is a summary of a Call to Action request from the Nebraska Catholic Conference. LB 586 which the NCC opposes is the priority bill of one Senator and thus is certain to be voted on by the Nebraska State Legislature. "LB 586 would make 'sexual orientation' and "gender identity" protected classifications under Nebraska's employment laws. All persons, including those who experience same-sex attractions, have inherent human dignity and must be treated with respect. But LB 586 would require employers, including entities and schools of the Catholic Church, to affirm sexual activity outside marriage between a man and a woman, and gender identity as a social construct. Employees could not be prevented from promoting such life styles. Employers who fail to comply with the new law could be subject to lawsuits and crippling penalties. There is no religious exemption for the Church or employers of conscience, and proposed amendments do not provide sufficient protection." The Catholic Conference encourages citizens to contact their State Senator and express their opposition to LB 586 that "would be harmful to our society and that would attack religious freedom."
