

The council officers send a happy Thanksgiving message to all of our brother Knights and their families. Many of you were involved in projects that have been continually worked on and we thank you for your efforts. A quick recap about those projects is:

The Council helped four men join the Knights of Columbus through the Admissions Degree.

All of the "Pew Widows" appreciate the commitment of "All Pews Installed By Thanksgiving" accomplished by their spouses. Twenty eight sets of sixteen "footers" and thirty sets of ten "footers" and six sets of "other footers "are now in place. The cry room, chapel and others are in the pipeline. The remainder of hymnal holders and kneelers will be installed followed by the engineering and installation of the modesty panels.

This Sunday November 29, 2015 we have the Corporate Communion and Mass for our deceased Knights. The necrology of the council deceased Knights will be read at the mass. Following the Mass coffee and pastries will be served in the Finigan Social Hall.

An event that was very moving for those that attended was the November 11, 2015, second annual, parish military Veterans Mass, patriotic posting of the colors and flag folding with a reading for each fold. One of our loveable parishioners, Lou Clupny, was draped in an honor quilt at the end of the Veterans Mass. Veterans were listed, in the church vestibule, by their time served and their branch. Council members helped the STARS staff setup the gymnasium for an enjoyable evening. One of the highlights of the STARS event was the "Teaser Wallet" donated by the council. The auctioneer played it very well, even putting a value on the wallet.

Maintenance of snow removal equipment is ongoing as is the request for snow removal crews. So if there is snow please come early, to the mass you attend, and shovel the church sidewalks. We can all appreciate the relatively even surfaces of concrete sidewalks now.
