## PRO-LIFE RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

This is a brief update on LB 586 which was discussed in the May newsletter. As noted by the Nebraska Family Alliance in May 15 email, the above bill was "tabled" for 2015. LB 586 would have added "sexual orientation and gender identity" to the Nebraska non-discrimination statue. It was tabled or withdrawn from further debate by the state senator who introduced the bill when he realized he did not have the 25 votes to advance the bill to the second of three required rounds of debate. In my view, it contains provisions similar to -- if not more extreme – than those of the so-named "Fairness Ordinance" proposed in the Lincoln City Council a few years back. You'll recall the approximately 10,000 signatures gathered on a petition at churches -- including St. Pat's -- and by organizations to oppose that ordinance.
